WORSHIP NOTES

Maundy Thursday (also called Holy Thursday) is the day the church commemorates the Last Supper when Jesus broke bread with his disciples for the last time before his arrest and crucifixion. The word *maundy*, a Middle English word, derives from the Latin *mandatum*, meaning *mandate* or *commandment*., reminding us of Jesus' commandment on that night that we are to love and serve one another.

Tenebrae, from the Greek, meaning shadows or darkness, is the name given to a worship service in which we center our minds and hearts on the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus. This evening's service reflects the seriousness and sorrow of the last hours of Christ's life. The growing darkness depicts for us the journey toward the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ. When all is dark, a bell mournfully tolls 33 times, representing the age of Christ at his death according to tradition.

The congregation may remain in prayer as you depart in silence, but know that the light is but hidden, shadowed by the cross and death, but that is not the end of the story.
